NOTE 1- SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

<u>Nature of Operations</u> –Building on Love, Inc. is a publicly supported charity whose primary purpose is to provide financial support to families who are facing a life threatening medical condition.

<u>Accounting for Net Assets</u> – The Foundation's net assets, the excess of assets over liabilities, are reported in three mutually exclusive classes:

<u>Permanently Restricted</u> – Those net assets resulting from inflows of assets whose use is limited by donor-imposed restrictions, which do not expire by passage of time.

<u>Temporarily Restricted</u> – Those net assets resulting from inflows of assets whose use is limited by donor-imposed restrictions, which expire by passage of time or are fulfilled by actions of the Foundation.

<u>Unrestricted</u> – Those net assets that are neither permanently or temporarily restricted.

<u>Revenue Recognition</u> – Income is recognized when earned and expenses are recorded when incurred, the accrual method of accounting. All gifts are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> – Property and equipment are carried at cost. Depreciation of property and equipment is provided using the straight-line method based on an estimated useful life of five (5) years.

<u>Income Taxes</u> – The Corporation is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

<u>Leases</u> – The Company has made a policy election not to capitalize certain short-term leases with a lease term of twelve (12) months or less.

<u>Use of Estimates</u> - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosures of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from these estimates.

The money held in the non-interest bearing checking account is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS- MARKETABLE SECURITIES

Building on Love, Inc. received donations of publicly traded stock at various times, which are being held in an E*Trade brokerage account.

Investment securities are reported at fair value according to a fair value measurement hierarchy. The fair value hierarchy is based on inputs to valuation techniques that are used to measure fair value that are either observable or unobservable. Observable inputs reflect assumptions market participants would use in pricing an asset or liability based on market data obtained from independent sources while unobservable inputs reflect reporting entity's pricing based upon their own market assumptions. The fair value hierarchy has three levels. Level 1 inputs are quoted market prices in an active market for identical assets or liabilities. Level 2 inputs are quoted for similar assets in markets that are not active, inputs other than quoted prices that are observable, and market corroborated inputs which are derived principally from or corroborated by observable market data. Level 3 inputs are derived from valuation techniques in which one or more significant inputs are unobservable.
